# Sexual harassment continues to be an unacceptably common feature of Australian workplaces:



## 1 in 3

33% of workers have experienced workplace sexual harassment in the last five years. (1)



## 2 in 5

40% of people who made a formal report or complaint about sexual harassment said no charges occurred at their workplaces as a result. (1)



#### 50%

50% of sexual harassment incidents are repeated, and of those, half continue for more than one year. (1)



## 1 in 5

In 2022, 19% of people were sexually harassed at work.  $(\mathbb{1})$

More than a third believe their organisation should be doing more to prevent and address workplace sexual harassment. (1)
